National Education Union - strike action for teachers

As you may have seen, the National Education Union (NEU) has confirmed that their teaching members will be taking industrial action in the form of two strike days. The first date scheduled for the strike is Thursday 27th April. The second day of the strike is Tuesday 2nd May..

This action is not against Outwood Academy City itself but is part of national industrial action organised by the trade unions about salary negotiations with the Department for Education.

Neither the Outwood Grange Academies Trust Board nor myself as Principal are legally allowed to close the academy in sympathy with the strike, and we will not do so. However, our main concern is the health and safety of our students. The academy will only close (partially or fully) if, in our opinion and following a full risk assessment, it is not safe to remain open.

Due to the number of staff taking action, we have made the difficult decision to close the academy on 2nd May to all students, apart from Year 11 and our vulnerable students who will be expected to attend as normal. .

Whilst the academy will be closed to some students, online learning (set tasks) via Google Classroom will be available to all students and students will be expected to complete the work set.

Students in all year groups Y7 to Y10 in receipt of free school meals may collect a pre-ordered grab bag between 12.30 and 13.00. Grab bags need to be ordered by 16.00 on Monday 1st May via this link - [Grab Bag order form](#)

The School bus will run as normal for Y11 and vulnerable students.

In order to ensure that we can communicate any changes to these plans at short notice; which may include on the day itself, we are asking parents/carers to ensure that we hold up to date emergency contact details. We will always endeavour to minimise disruption as much as possible.

We understand that there will be concerns about the disruption but we want to give you this advance notice and thank you in advance for your patience and understanding at this time.
